

The Polly Earl Award

The Polly Earl Award was established in 2005. Honoring the work of the late Polly Earl, who served as Executive Director of the Foundation for over twenty years, the award recognizes property owners for the restoration or rehabilitation of a smaller-scale, landmarked property integral to the charming neighborhoods of Palm Beach.

The Foundation is now accepting nominations for this award. Please nominate **one project** you or your firm has undertaken which you believe maintains the scale and relationship of the building to the streetscape and neighboring properties while also allowing the structure to be sensitively updated to meet code requirements and the owner's needs.

In making your nomination please be sure your project meets the following criteria:

- The project must be within the Town of Palm Beach.
- The project is for a private residence.
- The project must be a restoration or rehabilitation of a landmarked property.

Please also adhere to the following instructions:

- Nominations are due by April 26, 2020.
- Application for the award must include:
 - a. Letter of application addressed to the Preservation Foundation of Palm Beach.
 - b. Detailed description of the project.
 - c. Photographs and basic floor plans and elevations no larger than 11" x 17".
- All materials submitted become the property of the Preservation Foundation and will not be returned to applicants.
- Winner agrees to allow the Preservation Foundation to release documents, plans, and photographs of the project to the media, and use said information for future publications of the Preservation Foundation.
- The award will be presented in the Spring of 2021.
